Dorothy Radebaugh Obituary

Dorothy N. Radebaugh (nee Keyser), 98, formerly of Elyria, died March 4, 2024. She was born September 15, 1925 in New Athens, Harrison County, Ohio and was a 1943 graduate of Franklin High School in New Athens. For 10 years, Dorothy had been employed at General Industries, Elyria and then for 22 years as a secretary at MB Johnson School of Nursing in Elyria, retiring in 1987. She attended LaPorte United Methodist Church and enjoyed playing bridge and was a member of several bridge clubs.
